From The Pastor's Desk

The liturgies we sing on Sundays provide the framework for our gatherings. This summer we will comply with the mandate written into the church's constitution that we will sing and speak the liturgy written by Pastor John Monson two times per month. It certainly fits our setting, especially the song of praise Dance With Creation. The mention of loons, bears, and the other aspects of the natural beauty of the north woods inspire gratitude for God's gifts.

The word liturgy means "the work of/for the people." The liturgy may have started out as a form of work, but it doesn't feel like it when we gather and offer our thanks and praise. We have other forms of work to do with summer projects and programs, but they seem to consistently bring joy and fellowship.

The Sundays after Pentecost return to gospel readings from Mark. During the Easter season we spent many Sundays in the Gospel of John, and had some detours into Luke/Acts. OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Foundation Siding on South & East Side of Sanctuary: Total cost from Gull Construction per quote \$8,324.71. Work has been completed. MSP to approve final payment of \$5,978.00 which was \$420 above quotation. Everyone was satisfied with the project.
- 2. Report on Boiler Activity during the Winter: After Samuelson/Laney adjusted the flame, the boilers worked very well.
- 3. Snow shoveling: Brian Schultz temporary contract worked out very well. He cleared the snow 2 inches or below. Chuck is writing the contract for next year.
- 4. Solar Panel Snow Removal: Dave Kahler, Lewie Schrupp and Pastor Leif cleaned the panels. Thank you to the volunteers.
- 5. Repair of Conference Room Sink & Basement Toilet: Thank you to Dick Ristow for taking care of both.
- 6. Electronic Sign: MnDOT Update? No word from MN DOT. Project to be in 2025
- 7. Summer Lawn Services: Brian Schultz has been hired to mow the lawn this summer.
- 8. Discuss other duties: Fertilizer, Weed & Feed plus other requested tasks.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Brotherhood Mutual Insurance Renewal: Discuss Yearly Premium Increase \$5,792 to \$7,206 Property deductible from \$2,999 to \$5,000A 1% Hail Meeting adjourned. & Wind deductible was added to the policy. Discussion followed regarding increased cost, and all agreed that since we had a competitive bid last year and the company could not match our costs, we will accept the increase.

2. PROPANE Quotation from Superior Fuel: A lengthy discussion followed Lewie and Dave's Pros and Cons on switching providers. After weighing the cons, MSP that we continue our contract with Ferrellgas this year.

- 3. STEEPLE CLEANING: It was reported to me that the steeple is very dirty. The property Committee decided to talk to Steve Hoopman for suggested contacts. All agreed that the roof is too steep to expect our members to volunteer. Issue tabled.
- 4. CUT DOWN PEW (S) FOR WHEELCHAIRS: Decision was made to remove one pew for the time being.
- PAPER STORM: SHREDDING SERVICE?: 5. Missed this topic!!!
- 6. WRAP-UP OF CLEANING DAY: We had 24 ambitious members doing mostly indoor work. Lewie and Steve Hoopman spread a yard of mulch where needed. The Hydrangea's were pruned, and some other shrubs will be pruned when the weather allows. Dick Ristow was able to wash most of the outside windows.
- 7. COUNTRY FAIR: Lewie asked for some help getting tables from the Lion's on Monday, July 15th @ 9 AM from the Community Building. Ron & Ruth Brauer will be purchasing a new tent for use at the Flea Market and Country Fair. They will put it up and asked for help in taking it down.
- 8. BUNN Coffee Maker: Shirley reported that our original BUNN has been having some problems. In doing some research a minimum cost of the direct plumbed BUNN costs about \$850.00 not including the plumbing. More research will be done. Cost may be obtained from Memorial donations. TBD.
- 9. Fellowship Hall fluorescent lighting. Russ received permission to get quotations for upgrading the lighting to update to LED Fixtures. Tabled till next month.
