Hello Hackensack Family,

It's been over a year since we came to visit you. First off, thank you! Your prayers for our family have definitely been heard, and we have experienced an immense amount of favor in the local community. Our medical work has been a big adjustment, but it gives us daily opportunities to show mercy and hope. We have many local friends who provide us companionship. We even have locals who desire to read our Book with us, which is remarkable considering many have never met a Christian.

The kids are settling in well. One big, answered prayer has been their schooling. Right after we arrived, a new school was opened which had small class sizes and two English-speaking teachers. The boys attend half-time with supplemental education at home. School gives them the opportunity to learn the local language and have friends, which they enjoy.

Another answered prayer has been our health and safety. Praise God, other than the ubiquitous GI bugs, we have all been surprisingly healthy and had no major security incidents. Continue to lift this area up in your prayers.

We continue putting in many hours learning the local language. This dominates much of our free time. We have seen improvements, but it feels like there is still an awfully long way to go. Pray for our stamina in this process, as well as for good language teachers.

One thing we have been learning is that love is displayed in sacrifice (John 15:13). The locals continue to be confused why we, seemingly affluent and educated individuals from the USA, would move their whole lives to this tiny town. Even small things, like the unity and sacrifice we display for each other in our marriage, or in our relationships with our children, are completely counter cultural. The local religion's God has "99 names"... do you know which is missing? Love. Continue to pray for the locals to desire to know real, loving, Truth.

Upcoming Church Council Elections – 2025 Annual Meeting (Feb 15, 2026)

At this year's Annual Meeting, we will be electing several key leadership positions: President, Vice-President, and two Council Members at Large.

President (2-year term)

- Presides over congregation and council meetings
- Ensure resolutions and duties are carried out
- Signs official documents and provides leadership to all committees and the Pastor
- Conducts meetings according to Christian principles and parliamentary procedure

Vice-President (2-year term)

- Acts in place of the President when needed
- Becomes President if the position becomes vacant

Council Members at Large (3-year term)

- Provide general oversight of the congregation's life, worship, mission, finances, property, and staff
- Help guide long-term planning and annual budgeting
- Meet monthly (or as needed), including via remote options
- Limited to two consecutive terms
