There was a balance of over \$4,000.00 in the Fellowship Fund before the lefse project. The lefse project generated \$1,661,.00. The gifted expenditures were \$2,000.00. There is still a balance of over \$3,800.00 in the Fellowship account.

All expenses for the lefse project were paid for with the Thrivent Action Team card.
